## BUSINESS IMPROVED

**Bradstreet's and Dun's Fa-  
vorable Reports.**

Especially so as They Relate  
to the South.

**Remarkable Showing of Clearing  
House Records.**

**Gains in Most Departments of Manu-  
facture and Trade.**

**Increased Railroad Earnings—Money Market**

Confidence—Steadiness in Prices a Feature of  
the Week.

New York, Feb. 4.—Bradstreet's to-mor-  
row will say: "The tone of the cotton  
goods situation is, if anything, improved.

Southern buyers are coming into St. Louis  
more numerously than usual at this time.

At the south trade is reported improved at  
several important centres, and the total  
of January business is above the average.

The light freeze did little damage to Flori-  
da truck farming interests. Steadiness in

prices has been a feature of the week. Bank

clearings for January in total for seventy-  
two cities aggregate \$5,974,000,000, a gain  
of one-sixth of one per cent. over Decem-  
ber, 1897, of 3.7 per cent. over January of  
last year; of 27 per cent. over January, 1896,  
and of nearly 48 per cent. over Janu-  
ary, 1894. Money is relatively easier here  
than in London."

Dun's Review will say to-morrow: "The  
actual payment through clearing houses

in January made a remarkable showing,

being much larger than in any previous  
month, 38.3 per cent. larger than the same  
month last year, and 7.1 per cent. larger  
than in 1892. The failures in January

were smaller than in any previous year  
of which there is record, and probably smaller  
than in any other January since 1881. The

statement by branches of business given

this week shows a surprising gain in most  
departments of manufacture and trade. No  
failures appear in woolen manufacture, and

in several branches only an insignificant  
aggregate compared with the failures of  
previous months.

"Meanwhile, the money market is as  
confident as ever, gold does not come from

Europe in large amounts only because  
bankers find it worth while to lend Ameri-  
can money abroad, and commercial balances

are heavily in favor of the United States  
as heretofore.

The spot price of cotton remains un-  
changed, but the fact that receipts continue

larger than during the same week of 1896,  
after the heaviest crop ever known, checks

speculative operations for an advance.

There are many orders for women's shoes,  
and from the south much larger than last  
year. There is a better demand for cotton  
goods, since the general stoppage of the  
works at the east, but there is no indica-  
tion as yet of material gain as respects  
unsold stocks on hand. Railway earnings

show an increase for January, as far as re-  
ported, of 16.1 per cent. over last year,  
and 7.8 per cent. compared with 1892. Fall-  
ures for the week \$35, last year \$11.

nue between Patton avenue and Barret-

street, was submitted. After considerable

discussion the matter was carried over.

Water Superintendent Roberts brought

table of costs, giving the increase that

these meters made in water rents, espe-  
cially in the hotels. Owing to the confu-  
sion caused by defective meters, Mr. Roberts

requested that he be allowed to collect

rents this quarter according to the old  
method.
