SOUTHERN FEDERAL PRISON

It is a Sure Thing for Raleigh-Asheville not in it.

The despatch from Raleigh printed in the Gazette last week stating that the federal prison for southern convicts would be located at the state capital is confuted by the Atlanta Journal. The Journal says: "Georgia's federal convicts will hereafter be sent to the North Carolina penitentiary at Raleigh, instead of the federal prison at Columbus, Ohio."

"An order designating the North Carolina prison for Georgia prisoners, was issued by Attorney General Griggs on February 26, and this morning Judge W. T. Newman passed an order conforming to that of the United States attorney general, and all prisoners hereafter, sent out from this court will go to Raleigh."

"The prison at Columbus was selected for Georgia prisoners by the attorney general in 1888 and many notable Georgia convicts have been sent there."

"The prison, which is one of the largest in the United States, is said to be very badly overcrowded at present, and it was necessary to find more room. It was also shown that the climate of Ohio was very severe on natives of Georgia, and it is thought in several instances to have produced death or broken the constitution of the prisoners."

"The placing of the prisoners at Raleigh will keep them in a climate to which they are accustomed and also prove a great saving in transportation to the government. It will also doubtless prove a much more acceptable place of abode to the prisoners."

The special train which brought Innes and his famous "Fifty" to Charlotte was a record breaker. The train was in charge of Conductor Laird and Engineer Jonas Curlee. It had orders to put the band in here at two o'clock. It left Spartanburg, S. C., at 12:24, and at 1:58 was standing in the Southern yard in Charlotte, having run seventy-eight miles in eighty-nine minutes. This included a stop of four minutes at Blacksburg, two minutes at Gastonia, and one minute at Bessemer City. Capt. Laird and Engineer Curlee are the men to get over ground. Engineer Curlee is one of the youngest engineers on the road, and one of the best.—Charlotte Observer.
