The Majority in Both Houses Determined that Spain Shall not Escape-President Notified He Must Act Soon or Whole Matter will be Taken Out of His Hands-Spain's Suggested "Armistice" Regarded as a Trick to Gain Time.

ALONE IS FRIENDLY. REPORT OF

Congress not Willing to Trust Any Longer to Spain's Message from McKinley Accompanying it Shows a Mild "Sense of Justice" and is Burning With Indignation.

Opposes the President's Willingness to Yield to Sagasta's Request For an "Amistice"-Plan Causes Astonishment.

s a feeling of fierce indignation in both houses of congress that will undoubtedly find expression at tomorrow's session. There is a burning desire to avenge the deal; of the Maine victims, whom it is now officially known were killed by submarine mine that blew up the battleship. The great majority in both houses are determined that Spain shall not escape scot free. The president hopes the report submited today will remain in committee until he can negotiate further with Spain, but it is known tonight that he has been notified that he must act soon or the whole matter will be taken out of his hands. He therefore has expedited matters with renewed energy and hopes to have the whole question settled peaceably.

SAME OLD GAME.

Spain has "suggested" an armistice to last until the terms of settlement of the entire Cuban situation can be arranged. The president is inclined to accept, but on the distinct understanding that the armistice is to be followed by permanent peace and practical independence.

The great majority in congress believe this farcible and merely the old game of Spain to gain time.

The president has consulted very few people in regard to this remarkable and surprising plan and its announcement came like a thunderclap from a clear sky. The chances are the president will not be allowed to carry out his plan. It is officially announced tonight that he will not send a message to congress tomorrow asking for an appropriation for purchasing supplies for the suffering reconcentrados but will delay sending the message until a more opportune time.
