CITY NEWS.

The walk in County Tax Collector Chambers office are being re-papered.

Two new six-room cottages will be erected on Adkin street by Gaston Meares.

Clerk Sumner was engaged yesterday in issuing citations to delinquent administrators and guardians.

A meeting of the Men's Missionary society of the First Presbyterian church was held last night at Dr. R. F. Campbell's residence on Grove street.

The storekeepers and gaugers, in the revenue office were paid off yesterday. Collector Harkins signed 274 checks, aggregating \$12,000.

A new building of the Y. M. C. A. is to be organized in the Asheville Farm school, at Denmark. Secretary Van Horn and State Secretary W. M. Lewis will act as organizers.

The twenty-minute schedule was resumed on the Biltmore trolley line yesterday, instead of a car every forty minutes. The two new cars, recently purchased, will be used today.

The Southern Express company is preparing to move to No. 72 South Main street, under the Asheville hotel. The new quarters will be ready for occupancy about the first of next month.

The non-commissioned officers for company G, A. L. I., will not be appointed until the return of Captain T. W. Bookhart, from Baltimore. Officers have been detailed in the meantime.

Justice Van Gilder orders that in the case of Lucy Duff, G. A. Meares & Sons refused to prosecute as the husband of the accused woman paid for the skirt. The costs were imposed on the prosecutor.

The grid, and much needed work of flushing the paved streets in the city was commenced by the street department yesterday, to the intense satisfaction of business men and the convenience of pedestrians.

A letter received in the city yesterday states that Major Thomas O'Connor, who was one time connected with W. B. Keeling in the management of the Asheville hotel, died on December 26th, at Harbor Springs, Mich.

Chief Lyerty has received a letter from R. A. Peetman, of Erie, N. C., stating that Dr. J. Morgan, a colored man, has stolen his horse and sold it in York, S. C. Mr. Peetman is certain that Morgan is hiding in this city.

President Jones of the Asheville college, visited to the Gazette yesterday that he is considering applications for admission from young ladies residing in thirty-nine different states and one application from Honolulu.

Miss Jennie Crute, a young lady of this city, while out walking with an escort on Spring street, yesterday evening fell and broke her arm, just above the wrist. The fracture received the prompt treatment at the hands of Dr. D. B. Sevier.

Alting Police Justice R. J. Stokely fined two cases of drunkenness, \$3 apiece yesterday morning. The case of Homer Belmore who is charged with the theft of a pair of shoes from J. M. Stoner's store on South Main street, was continued until this morning.

The directors of the board of trade held no meeting yesterday afternoon, as many members failed to recognize his extreme importance and were absent. The directors will meet this afternoon at 4 o'clock and it is unlikely that every director be present to transact the important business, which will be brought up.

French Broad avenue has been transformed into a huge mud hole, since the present heavy snow struck Asheville. The residents, however, are congratulating themselves that the city has decided to improve the condition of this thoroughfare. Superintendent of Streets J. B. Bohn has been instructed to macadamize the street.

D. C. Wheeler, of Madison county, is in the city and tells a cold story from his section. He says that yesterday morning he drove a heavily loaded wagon, drawn by four horses a distance of 200 miles in the snow that had frozen over a branch in the road to such a thickness that no power did a wheel break through. Mr. Wheeler says that the mountains around Laurel are covered with snow and ice.
