ler's Successor

The mayoral possibilities for the coming election are already being hanvassed more than two months in advance of the event. It is probable that the election this year will be a hard fight, that the republicans will endeavor to recover some of their lost prestige in the county, by putting in some very active work in

There is also some expectation that o.nces of police justice and mayor will he combined at a salary of from \$1,200 to \$1,800 annually. In fact, unless this is substituted in the amendments to the city charter, the bill will be defeated in the senate of the legislature.

The democratic ranks have a large amount of good material to select from. Many excellent names are suggested for the office of mayor. From an authen tic source the information is derived that the nominaton will fall to one of the following democrats: A. Rankin, Capt. James P Salwyer, Sam. H. Reed, W. R. Bearden, Capt. W. W. West City Astorney Dillon M. Luther, or

W. F. Snider. Capt. T. W. Patton will undoubtedly be the nominae of any independent party, Collector Harkins said to the Gazette resterday that he would vote for Capt. Pattom for mayor, even if he ren on an independent ticket. "You can say for me," said the collector, "that in my estimation, Capt. Patton was the best mayor the city ever had. He did more for Asheville and will do more to aid the city's progress than any man I ky of, in any pairty." J. Wiley Shook, who was present, expressed himself in the

The best informed politiciams do not enticlipate that any independent ticket will enter the field. It is asserted, however, that the Arti-Salton League will introduce a ticket, headed by either F. M. Miller, Parley Meurs or J. W. Allbright, for mayor.

In case the office is not gobbled up by a political mayor, the secondary struggle willcemter around the office of police justice. The candidate who will get nomination at the republican primaries is not even guessed at as yet, but in the democratic ranks, the present incumbent, George W. Tilson and W P.
