Mrs. Amanda M. Hale Condemns the

Pasteur Trea ment. Dr. Amanda M. Hala delivered her address on the "Fallacies of the Pasteur Treatment" at Miss Gano's last even ing.

She was very eloquent over the confi dence and affection a dog shows to man Everyone in the world, mother, wife, best friend, may prove false, but a dog will follow you to the end of the earth and then die upon your grave. She read several extracts from au thors praising the dog and illustrating his fidelity, and deprecated the fact that such a creature should be used for cruel experiments that, she said, would benefit no one.

Dr. Hale said that rabies and hydro phobia are almost unknown. The cases heard of only imaginative, and are more often fatal by taking Pasteur's treatment than if let alone. In the large cities hundreds of people are bit ten but never have aydrophobia. Mad dogs don't froth at the mouth, and they will drink water as long as they can swallow, and then will plunge their heads in it. A mad dog is a sick dog, and goes straight to some seclud ed spot to die. He might snap at a person directly in his vay, but would not go out of his way to bite. A dog with a fit froths at the mouth and acts strangely but is harmless. The Pas teur treatment has increased the death rate from so called hpdrophobia won derfully in France, but in Germany, where they don't believe in the treat ment, hydrophobia is extremely rare. All serum treatments were condemn ed as doing no good to men and causing great suffering among animals.
