Manila, Saturday Evening, April 1. -MacArthur today made a reconnois sence of the country in the direction of Calumpit, on the railroad northeast of Malolos, penetrating within a mile of that place. No insurgents were found. The monitor Monadocck was fired up on by insurgent artillery today. The vessel replied, silencing the enemy. The insurgents are reported gathering n force at Cainta and Taytay.

The Americans are having a much nceded rest at Malolos. MacArthur has established headquarters in the former Filipine ball of congress and the troops are making themselves com fortable around town.

The army gunboats will prepare water base on the river when Calumpia is atacked and an armored train is in readiness for use to the north when the advance is resumed.

The absence of extensive camp de bris on the ground indicates that the enemy's force has been exaggerated.

LOAN REFUSED.

Havana, April 1 .- The Cuban assem bly met at Cerro today. Despatches vere read from the commissioners, who were sent to the United States to attempt to raise a loan, saying that they had failed to accomplish their mis sion, and would leave for Cuba tomor row. Sanguilly read a despatch from an American syndicate saying it was willing to raise the loan and was bring ing its influence to bear in Washington. The assembly voted not to dissolve un til the commissioners had returned and

The organization of the so called Cu ban national party is proceeding. Meet ings are held nightly, and the promot ers have issued a manifesto to the peo ple of Havana, calling upon them to unite their efforts and to organize ward committees, with a view of dissemin ating information paparatory to a na tional convention. This movement, it is said, is due to the approaching elec tions, but it has already developed a split in eastern districts, where the Cu ban federalists have organized to pro mote a republic.

In Havana the national party finds ts opponent in the Liga Patriotica, an outgrowth of the recently dissolved Punta Patriotica, which is working along the same general lines. These dis connected efforts to establish a national party are regretted by the best Cuban element, as ultimate disaster is clearly
