ORCHARD AND GARDEN.

If trees are to be planted in the fall, the soil should first be prepared in good condition.

All small fruits should be planted far enough apart to admit of using the horse cultivator.

So far as it is possible large limbs should never be removed from plum and cherry trees.

Thrifty, growing trees yield the finest looking fruit; old and nurtured trees the richest fruit.

No variety of pears will ripen so finely on the trees as they will when gathered and ripened in the house.

Good feeding must attend rapid growth in trees and plants as well as in animals. Make the soil in the orchard rich.

In the pruning encourage the growth of new wood. Many trees and vines fall because the new wood is cut off, leaving the old.

With the peach the young trees should be started with low heads, the lower limbs not more than two feet above the ground.

Lice on trees may be killed by dissolving a pound of potash in a gallon of water and applying on the affected parts with a brush.
