The banks under government pressure have restored the exchange rate of two Mexcan silver dollars to one gold American dollar. General MacArthur has ordered the acceptance of American money for all public dues at the above rate. General Wright, Major Maus and others have returned from a trip to Benguet province, where they recommend the construction of a convalescent hospital. Benguet is tranquil. The Philippine commission, it is now announced, will make all future civil service appointments. Several minor engagements occurred last week in Luzon.
