CAROLINA NEWS.

A band of negro burglars has been captured at Newton. They had entered the house of five or six people and terrorized the town.

The Goldsboro Table company, a new corporation to manufacture tables, has a capital of \$12,000. Work on the plant has already begun at Goldsboro.

The Borden Manufacturing company, Goldsboro's new cotton mills, is ready for the machinery, which has already been purchased. It will be one of the finest cotton mills of the state.

Winston will break all former records this year in the sale of leaf tobacco. President Coleman's report Saturday shows that 21,073,240 pounds have been marketed in the eleven months of this tobacco year.

Rev. J. F. England, who is visiting here, and who is well known to many of our readers, was brutally assaulted by a school teacher named Weatherly at the postoffice at Ramseur, where he lives. On the Sunday previous he had preached a sermon in which he urged the importance of having only men of the highest moral character in politics, in the pulpit, in the school room.
