MISSING LINK.

Not For Are-like Man This Time, But For Facts to Prove Sayings Recorded in the Scriptures.

To find conclusive evidence that the deluge was universal, to discover facts which will prove that the waters cov-ered "the face of the earth," as recorded in the Scriptures, is the object of a journey which a distinguished American geologist, the Rev. George Frederick Wright, is making over the Roof of the World," the Central Asian

The journey is full of peril and hardship, but Dr. Wright, who has faced the dangers of Arctic exploration and who has led hazardous expeditions over the glaciers of Alaska, is no stranger to such things. Though sixty-four years old he is strong and vigorous. On the present expedition he is accompanied by his son, Frederick B. Wright, recently graduated from Yale college,

Both father and son were prisoners in the British legation during the slege of Peking. After the rescue of the legationers they went to Viadivostock and thence over the Trans-Siberian road to Lake Baikal, in the great Siberian plateau.

The Ararat range in Southwestern Asia, where Biblical story says the Arc of Noah found a resting place, will be explored by Dr. Wright. In these highlands, which are covered with "loess," or unstratified diluyian mud left by receding water, Dr. Wright hopes to find remains of men and animals left there before the flood.

If Dr. Wright discovers antediluvia: remains in Asia, the last link in a chain of facts which tend to prove that the globe was at one time flooded will be supplied. Geblogists admit that America and Europe were once under water. It has been known for years, that the greater part of Africa was once covered by the sea, but it remains to be shown that Asia, too, was once sub-

AN IMPORTANT MISSION. Within the last twenty years the views of scientific men as to the deluge have been reversed. Prestwich, English geologist, was the first to find evidences of a deluge in Europe. Sir J. William Dawson has supported the

universal deluge theory. In this country Dr. Wright has made investigations which seem to show that North America was once under water. Deposits of marine products and marine fossils have been found by Dr. Wright on our highest mountains, while the thin deposit of "loess," or inundation mud, that covers the major portion of the Rocky Mountain plateau is full of marine fossils, shells, and evidences of inundation.

Dr. Wright has spent his life in seeking to harmonize science and the Biblical story of the creation. He is a professor in Oberlin Theological Semlnary and professor of "The Relations of Religion and Science" at Andover. For several years he was an assistant on the United States Geological Survey.

The Scripture states that the water covered "all the high hills," and there are evidences of this in four continents, The water is said to have risen 15 cubits, or 23 feet, above the highest mountain. Scientists are asking where are the materials drifted up by the deluge, the remains of the millions of men and animals that perished by it. During the 150 days that followed the waters receded into the ocean beds much of this mud in the courses of the currents was carried back into the ocean. Geologists are perplexed over the depths of the deposits.

It is quite likely that Dr. Wright will find buried in the "loess" the wea-pons and tools used by men who lived before the flood, and for whose sine, the Scripture says, the world was drowned.

An intimate friend of Dr. Wright the Rev. Daniel S. Gregory, editor of The Homiletic Review. Before start-ing on his expedition Dr. Wright con-fided to Dr. Gregory his plans.
