President In Perfect Accord With His Party.

Refuses to Recede From His Positions on the Inspectors' Reports-When it Was Otherwise-General Hawley and the Army Bill.

Washington, Jan. 11. - [Special.] -There is no danger of a clash between the administration and either house of congress over any action, such as that of Secretary Root in refusing to send the Lawshe report to the senate, because there never was an administration in which the majority in both houses were in such perfect accord. None of the old timers about Washington remembers a president who has been so successful in getting along with each house of congress as President McKinley. I was talking with a senator about this the other day who has observed Business College several administrations, and he said that no man has ever paid the deference to congress that President McKinley has since he has been president, and for that reason he has had congress behind him in almost anything he wanted. Consequently whatever may be said about his refusal to send in the Lawshe report does not worry him at all, and he has ample grounds to believe that he is right, and, having reached that conclusion, he regards the case as closed. Some time ago Secretary Root refused positively to give out the reports of inspectors of the army, and, although quite a howl was raised in some quarters, it made no difference, and we get along just as if these inspectors' reports were published from time to time. Of course the secretary places the refusal to make public the Lawshe report at the present time on legal grounds, and that is said to be satisfactory to most of the lawyers of the senate, who recognize the necessity of keeping the case in the hands of the prosecution.

When It Was Different.

Of course reference is made to the fact that the senate actually passed a resolution of censure upon Attorney General Garland because he did not send certain information when it was requested by a senate resolution. It must be remembered, however, that the senate, during the first term of President Cleveland, was controlled by a hostile majority, which took advantage of every partisan case to criticise and condemn the administration. Now the senate is Republican and the administration is Republican, and it is idle to suppose that a Republican senate is going to condemn or criticise like that of President McKinley, which, as I said before, has a way of getting along with congress better than any previous administration in many years.

General Shafter has already passed the retiring age, but he is retained as a major general of volunteers and in command of the department of California, where he is rendering good service to the government. General Lee has also passed the retiring age. General Wilson has not C a short time. Both Lee and Wilson are now serving as volunteer brigadier generals, but they will get no benefit out of the retirement provision unless by a special act, save in the case of General Wilson, should he now be made a brigadier general in the regular army and retired with that rank. It is understood that all of these officers have expected to secure such recognition from the general government.
