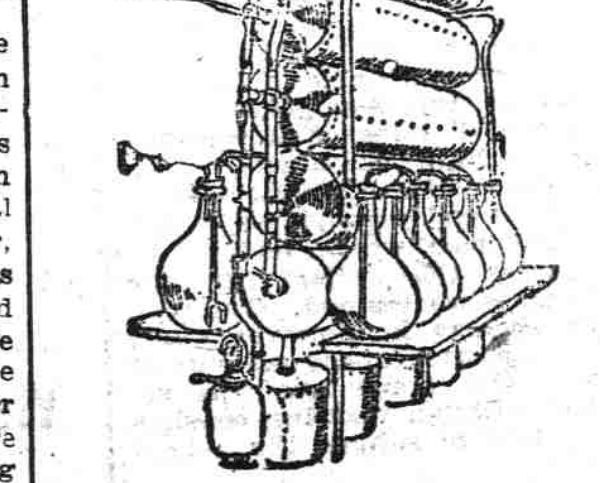

A \$100,000 fertilizer factory is to be built in Raleigh, as well as a large canning factory. There has been a halt for several weeks in the building of cotton mills as a result of the low price of yarns and cotton goods.

The Salisbury Sun says: Superintendent Ward of the Salisbury Cotton Mills has constructed a machine to make the waste of the mill into rope. The machine was operated one day last week and did satisfactory work.

In Wilmington Monday there was a sensational personal encounter between J. A. Perry, superintendent of streets, and Frank T. Mills, a prominent liveryman and harness dealer. The fight grew out of the charges by Mills that Perry, in buying teams and harness for the city insisted of being given a bonus for himself on each transaction.

Prof. T. G. Pearson, of Guilford College, was here today and was telling of some of the peculiar freaks which the little cyclone which visited that section a few days ago, played. The house of the old darkey, which was blown down, was directly in the path of the wind and not a timber of it was left except the steps, which happened to be just out of the path of the wind and were left unmoved. A chicken was blown some distance and left hanging by the head in a tree, about twelve feet from the ground. The chicken was entirely stripped of feathers, and was found hanging in the tree much as if they were hanging in a market.—Greensboro Telegram.

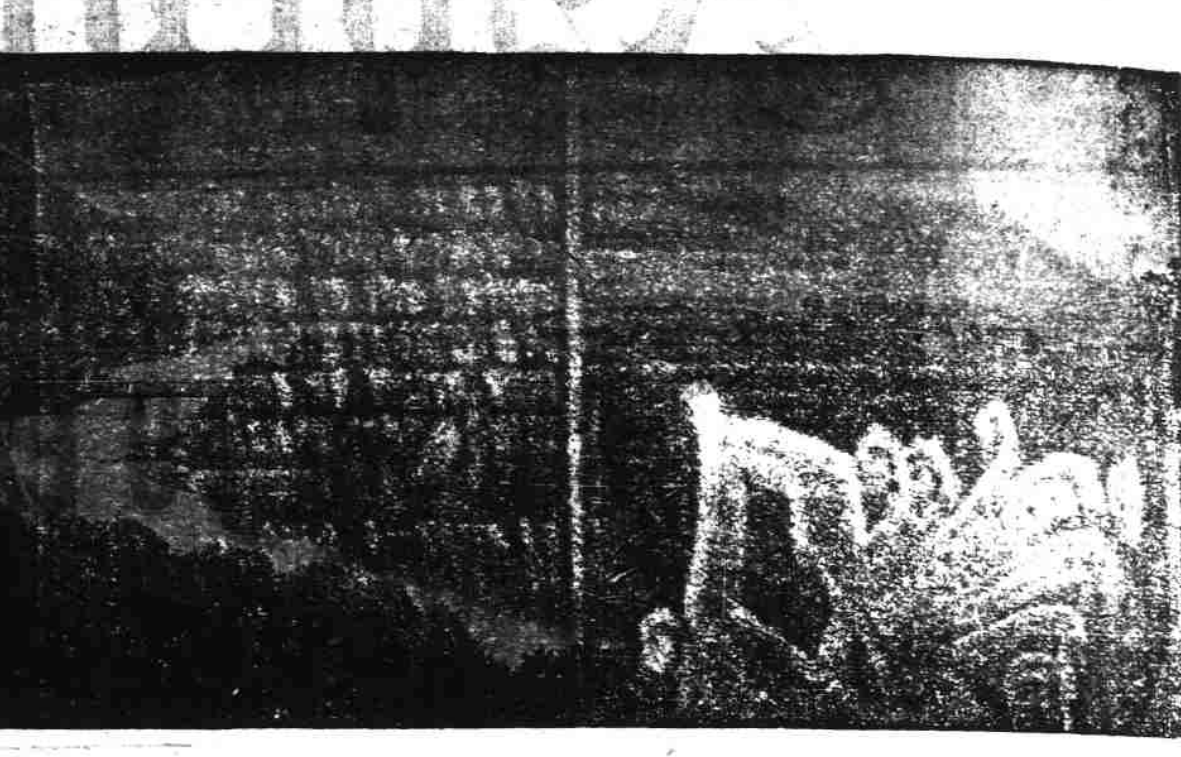
