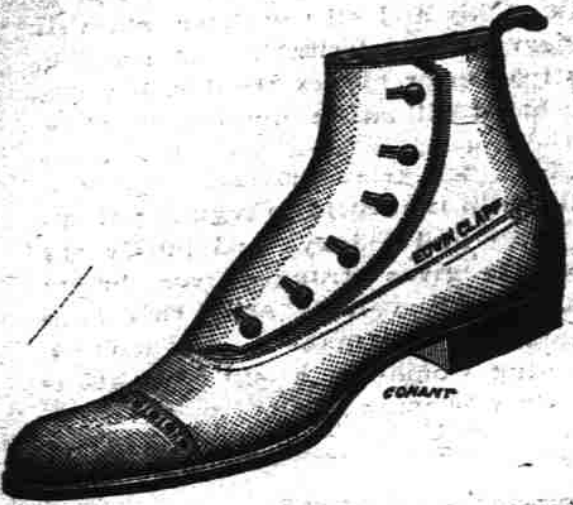

Interesting Notes of the Progress in Building.

Kingston, N. Y., in four weeks secured \$16,050, which clears its building debt within \$1,250.
