Orleans was quite active in trying to create bearish sentiment claiming that drought was all over and that splendid results would follow. It was quite natural that prices should have eased off, and it is surprising that the loss was not more serious.

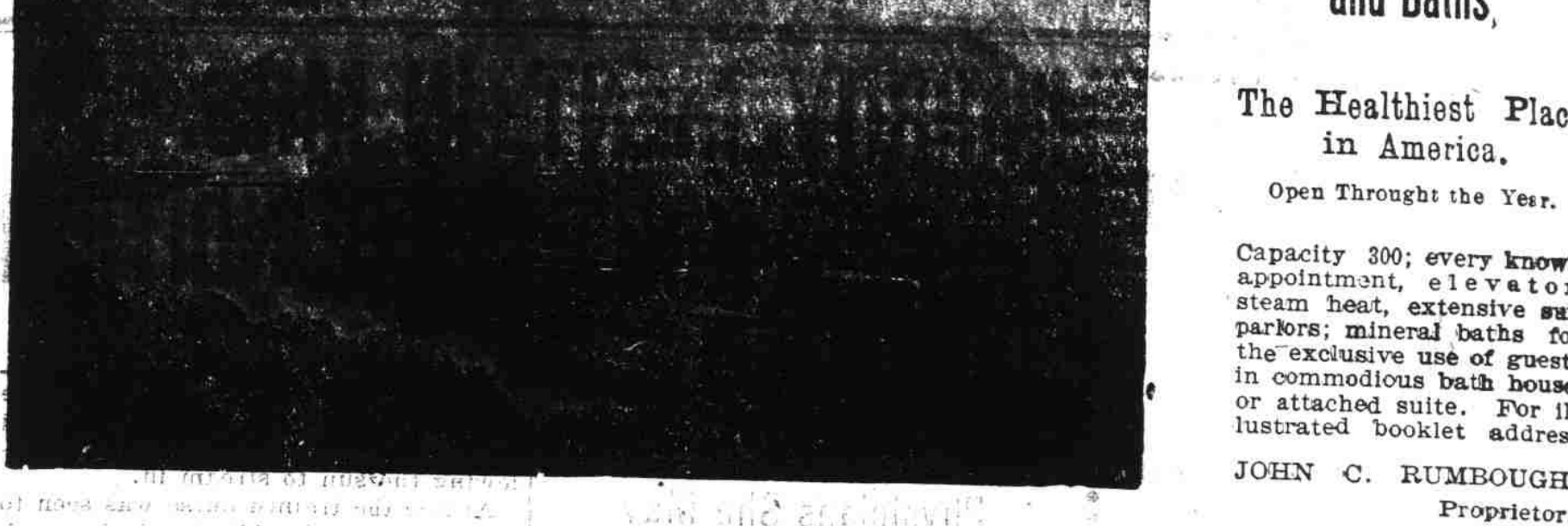
