TOBACCO STOCKS

ADVAN E.

Higest, Lowest and Closing Prices for Active Stocks Cotton Market Point.

New York, June 6.-The London market was favorably affected by the reduction of half of one per cent. in the hank of England's rate of discount as announced today and in consequence American stocks were quoted at a somewhat higher range of prices in comparison with the local final figures of yesterday. Partly in consequence of this circumstance and also because of the subsidence of the uneasiness regarding the status of Rock Island affairs the local stock market opened strong and fairly active. Rock Island again shot up quite rapidly in the early dealings but subsequently the stock receded to about yesterday's final figures. Particularly strong and active features upon the opening of business were Pennslyvania, Wisconsin Central, Southern Pacific, Louisville & Nashville and Norfolk and Western. Union Pacific was also dealt in quite heavily somewhat above yesterday's final prices. In the Industrial quarter further advances were shown in the Tobacco stocks and the United States Steel issues were firm on large dealings. The local traction stocks were fairly active and firm. The particular strength appearing in Southern Pacific was on the repitition of rumors recently current that the stock was to be very soon placed upon a regular dividend paying basis. Nothing else that was novel or definite attended the movement in the other stocks cited. Evidences of quite aggressive manipulation were noted in various quarters of the market and commission business was not upon a very large scale.

COTTON. New York, June 6 .- Texas is credited with six per cent. increase ac sage on the whole the showing is bullish and such is the view taken of it both here and at Liverpool. The effect here was an opening market of 6 to 7 points advance and early cables were correspondingly better. New York, June 6.-WHEAT-The market was quiet this morning showing narrow changes in price. There was selling on the weather report which showed good rains all along the Mississippi valley, the lake region and the Upper Missouri valley. The storm this week has now covered the entire winter and spring wheat country excepting Kansas. The weather was decidedly colder in the northwest with killing frost in spring wheat States was a factor in the trading. The opening of the market was quiet and there was some selling during the morning, owing to the improved weather conditions and the continuation of liberal receipts. Wheat was weak in the afternoon rallying a little on reports that the Missouri State report was 14 points lower.

The close was at the lowest. The corn market was quiet and generally lower. There was some selling on the freedom of the movement and the market was also influenced by the heaviness in wheat, although the cold


