Confirmation or Rejection of Treaty Said to Depend on One or Two Men.

BUT THE ISLANDS WILL BE OURS SOME DAY.

THEY ARE NOT SELF-SUPPORTING POSSESSIONS, AND THIS FACT WILL ARGUE STRONGLY IN FA-VOR OF SALE TO UNITED STATES

Washington, Oct. 18 .- Advices received here, while not fully confirming the private report circulated in the Danish West Indies to the effect that the chances are against the acceptance, by the Danish rigsdag, of the treaty of cession to the United States, make it appear that the fate of the pending treaty is really very uncertain. He de- well satisfied that the people of Denmark will be eventually moved by purely economic considerations to dispose of the islands. It is well known here, just as was stated in the rigsdag, that at present the islands are not self-supported and the Danish government, if it decides to retain possession, is confronted with the necessity of paying money out of the national treasury to help the islanders to sustain their local government. It is realized that in the event of cession to the United States this state of affairs, as to deficiency in revenues, would probably continue for sometime, necessitating the extension of some measure of support by the United States government until such time as the islands develop to the point of pay their way. Much is expected of free trade between the islands and the United States in the development of the insular industries, but on the other hand the very great increase of trade with the United States would, under free trade, deprive the island treasury of revenues now collected on imports from the United States and compensation must be sought from some other source.
