### SULTAN WILL PAY

New York, Nov. 4.—A threat by the French government to stop the quotation of the Turkish loan of 1896 on the Paris bourse unless the porte gave Losando and Tubini a written engagement to pay them out of the proceeds of the Turkish debt conversion, has, according to a Times dispatch from Constantinople by way of London, produced the desired effect and the matter has been settled by the porte. The Losando and Tubini claims were partly the cause of the dispatch of a French squadron to the island of Mytilene just a year ago. As a result of that action, the sultan promises to satisfy all the French demands.

### British Steel Trust?

New York, Nov. 4.—While denials of J. P. Morgan's London partners respecting prospective purchases of the coal fields and collieries of Staffordshire, are considered unconvincing in that quarter, it is evident, cables the London correspondent of the Tribune, that a combination of some kind has been formed for controlling the production of the collieries. If this combination be exclusively British it will be followed by a similar movement in other mining sections. Amalgamations of the British iron and steel industries are constantly going into effect. A British steel trust may be the final result, after numerous small amalgamations.

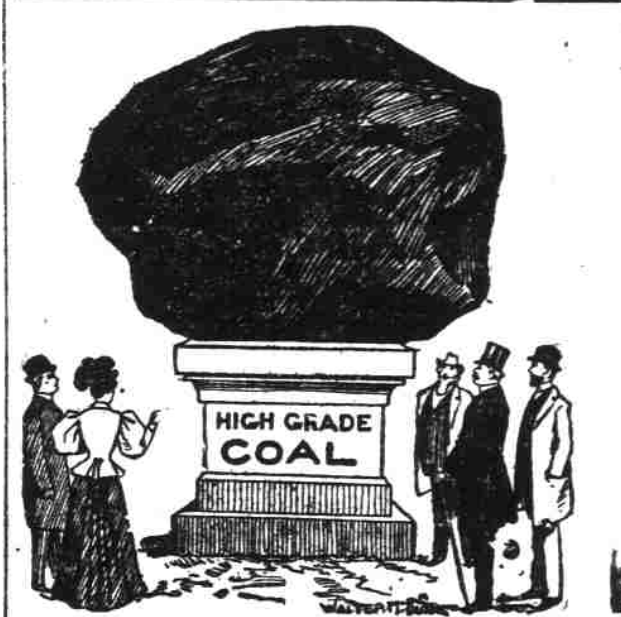
