## STOCKS' PRICES IN NARROW RANGE

A Moderately Active Market, With no Striking Changes—Some Gains.

New York, Aug. 9.—The opening of the stock market was moderately active, with no very striking changes in prices. The majority of the list showed gains, but there were slight fractional declines in the railroad list. Fractional fluctuations either way were frequent, with a tendency downward for a time in Harriman stocks. United States Steel, Amalgamated Copper and Reading. Offsetting these was a demand for several railroads and specialties. Toward 11 o'clock the entire market began to advance. Reading's rise through 165 had a sustaining effect, but the principal stocks moved narrowly, bonds irregular.

Both Union Pacific and United States Steel increased their earlier advances before the market became quiet and reactionary. Losses did not amount to much, speculation coming almost to a standstill, while awaiting the government report.

Stocks of railroads operating in the south were strong and United States Steel achieved a new record price of 78. Otherwise speculation was listless and confined to selected stocks. Louisville & Nashville gained 1/2 and Atlantic Coast Line 2 1/2 points.
