KANAWHA LUMBER CO. SALE IS CONFIRMED

Judge Pritchard signed an order this afternoon confirming the sale of the Kanawha Lumber company to A. R. Freeman, who was the highest bidder; the other bid being from Wilson Brothers of Pittsburgh. Mr. Freeman, who had assigned his bid to the Elizabeth Land and Lumber company of Virginia, amended his original bid of \$50,000 to \$55,000 for the plant and physical property of the Kanawha Lumber company and, agreed to pay \$5,000 for the lumber on hand. The Kanawha Lumber company, a South Carolina corporation, with offices at Conway, was placed in hands of a receiver several months ago on a complaint of George F. Hull, and the sale ordered, later by the court.

COST OF TAKING CENSUS IS NOT TO BE SO GREAT

Secretary Nagel Thinks He Has Found There Will Be Considerable Saving.
Washington, Aug. 17.—Secretary Nagel, who has returned to Washington, has tackled the work in connection with preparation for the next census with a view to getting it in such shape that he can return to his summer home in Massachusetts next week.
A considerable saving will be made, he has found, in the cost of taking the next census as compared with original estimates.

Board of Trade Desires to Assist in Locating Visitors in the City.

Kerr, secretary of the board of trade, requests that all the boarding houses and hotels in Asheville notify him at once regarding the number of people they can accommodate and the rates per week or day, so that he can assist the large number of people who are pouring into Asheville to find places to remain while here.
He wishes those who reply to give street number and telephone number, so that they can be easily communicated with. The railway people say that owing to lack of definite information some of the people who have come here have had to apply to several places before they could find places to stay. The telephone number of the board of trade is 584, and Mr. Kerr will be there to do all he can to locate those who come to Asheville. As large crowds are expected the rest of this week, if those who have vacant rooms and desire to have them filled, will send in this information at once, the board of trade can render valuable service both to those who have the rooms and those who desire them.

AN EARTHQUAKE RECORDED OF MODERATE INTENSITY

Origin of the Disturbance, It is Estimated, Was About 2,500 Miles Distance.

Washington, Aug. 17.—An earthquake of moderate intensity was recorded yesterday by the seismograph at the weather bureau, beginning at 2:55 a. m. It continued nearly an hour.
It was estimated that the origin of the disturbance was about 2,500 miles distant, either in California or on the Pacific coast of Mexico, or in the vicinity of the Azores.
Washington, Aug. 17.—Slight earthquake shocks were recorded by the seismograph at 2:22 p. m.
Takahira Sells for Home.
Seattle, Wash., Aug. 17.—Baron Kogoro Takahira, the Japanese ambassador, sailed for home today. The ambassador is going home to confer with the officials of the Japanese and most of the European countries, which will expire next year. He expects to return to Washington in the fall.

DENMARK'S CRISIS PASSES; NEW CABINET IS FORMED

Count Holstein Ledreborg is the New Premier, and Has Chosen His Cabinet.

Copenhagen, Aug. 17.—The ministerial crisis which followed the resignation of the Danish cabinet last month, because of its failure to secure the support of parliament for its project of military defense, has come to end with the formation of a new cabinet under the premiership of Count Holstein Ledreborg.

FIFTEEN SKELETONS FOUND NEAR BANKS OF POTOMAC

Some Indian or Piratical Tragedy of Early American History Probably Brought to Light.

Washington, Aug. 17.—Fifteen skeletons, lying together in such a position as to indicate hasty burial, and three English copper coins bearing date of 1729, found with the skeletons, during the excavating for the United States medical school hospital, near the banks of the Potomac, bring to light, it is believed, some Indian or piratical tragedy of early American days.
