Manual Training.

In the city schools, Dr. Harvey made a vigorous defense of manual training for boys. He offered conrete illustrations to show that it had een justified not only on grounds of ultural value but from a commercial standpoint. In some towns, he said it had been found that the boys could make a beginning of a study of their vocation by taking special work in manual training. The boys have found that this kind of training makes a concrete headway towards a living and their parents are willing to sacrifice so that a boy may be kept in high school a year or so longer to get this training.
