TRANSGRESSIONS WERE NUMEROUS

Total of 457 Cases Docketed and Adjudicated in Police Court in August.

Asheville was a bit naughty during the month of August, according to the record in city police court. In fact, according to this record, more cases were docketed and disposed of during the month by the police court justice than during any one previous month for the past two or three years.

The record shows that during the month a total of 457 cases were docketed and adjudicated. This number of arrests by the police department is a record-breaker for the year. It evidences two things: that the police department is active and on the alert and that the commission of misdemeanor is not on the decrease. The record shows that included in the 457 cases docketed 94 defendants were charged with being “drunk on the streets” and that an additional 26 defendants were charged with being “drunk and disorderly.” The record also shows that a total of 40 retailing cases were called to the attention of the court; that in the majority of instances conviction was had and road sentences were imposed; that in other cases fines were imposed and in still other cases the prosecuting witness was not believed and an entry of not guilty was made. Several of the prosecuting witnesses who “turned up” cases during the month found it convenient not to be present when the cases were called and not. pros. entries were finally made.

The 457 cases docketed and disposed of during the month of August included the following offenses: Drunk, 94; drunk and disorderly, 26; disorderly conduct, 53; assault, 60; assault with deadly weapon, 10; larceny, 14; keeping disorderly house, 3; aiding and abetting in keeping disorderly house, 10; procuring liquor, 1; retailing liquor, 40; carrying concealed weapon, 4; vagrancy, 45; gambling, 20; miscellaneous, 77. The record further shows that fines imposed during the month aggregated \$269; that costs aggregated \$19,85, and penalties \$560. The arrests during the month, counting 31 days, averaged almost 15 per day.
