### SCHEDULE READY FOR NEXT WINTER

Most of the Changes Will Be in Discontinuance of Pullman Lines.

The arrangements for discontinuing the winter schedule of the Southern Railway have been completed and the winter schedule will be introduced with the taking off of the summer trains and sleepers. The change for the most part simply consists in taking off the sleepers from southern cities but in every instance care has been taken not to cripple the service and it is thought that, considering the amount of winter travel, the winter schedule will prove sufficiently convenient.

Effecting on Monday, October 2, the present Memphis-Salisbury sleeping car has been handled on Nov. 25 and 26 and leaving Asheville for the east at 2:30 a. m. will be extended and made a Memphis-Richmond sleeping car line by way of Asheville. As this arrangement passengers can go from Memphis to Richmond and midway points without change.

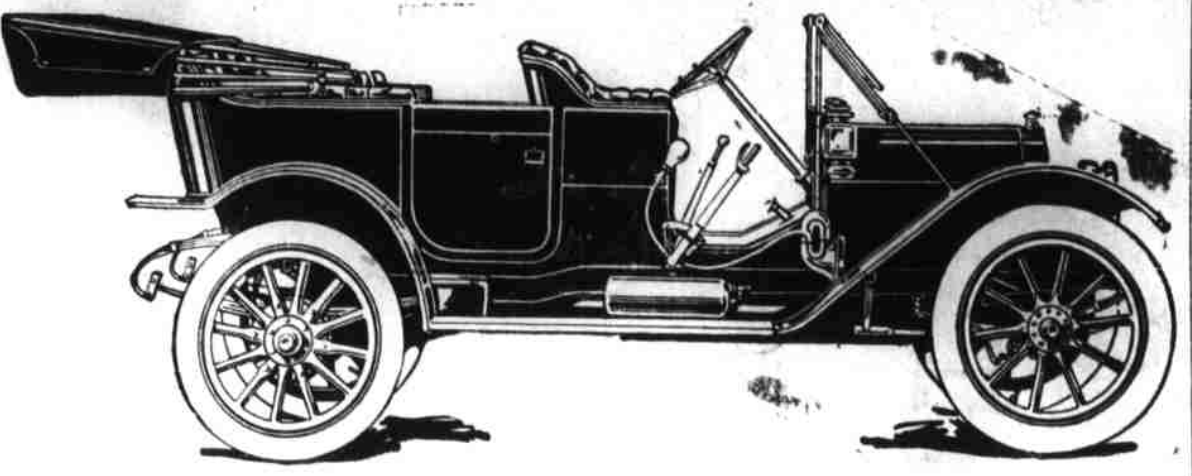
As stated yesterday, the Norfolk Asheville sleeper has been made permanent for the accommodation of passengers to New York, Philadelphia, Baltimore, Norfolk, and Richmond. There will also be chair car service to eastern Carolina points that are discontinued and the dates on which the last cars will leave Asheville.

The last car of the Mason-Asheville sleeping car service will leave Asheville Sunday night, October 2, that of the Memphis-Asheville sleeper on train No. 11 leaves Asheville Saturday, October 1, for the last trip, the Charleston-Asheville sleeper leaves Asheville, October 2.

The last car of the New Orleans tri-weekly sleeping car line by way of Chattanooga over the Queen & Crescent leaves Asheville Monday, September 27, that of the tri-weekly service to New Orleans by way of Atlanta and the L. & N. on Sunday, October 2.

Trains No. 41 and 42, leaving Asheville at 8:50 p. m., and returning from Columbia, will be discontinued after leaving Asheville Sunday, October 2. After these trains are discontinued the Jacksonville sleeper, which now leaves at 8:50 p. m., will leave Asheville on No. 19 at 4:10 p. m.

The tri-weekly parlor car from Asheville to Augusta will be discontinued after leaving Asheville Monday, September 26.
