The president of the Grand Theater company company wrote me to Columbia, where I have two theaters, asking me to come to Raleigh and see him, which did the last of August. He went over the situation and told me that the company was in very bad shape, and he personally owned 1000 opera chairs which were in the building, and the Grand Theater company owed him an acount of \$\$11.74. He made me a proposition to sell them to me, which I accepted. I ran the theater about four weeks and found that the company was hopelessly in debt and that should I put the theater on a good, paying basis others would derive the benefit instead of myself, and finding that I could not collect my account of \$811.74, as the Grand Theater company was insolvent, I immediately instructed my attorneys to bring suit against the Grand Theater company for the above amount.
