BUCKEYE WATER COMPANY NEEDS MORE FACILITIES

Condemnation Proceedings Begun for Rights of Way for Additional Pipe Lines.

The Buckeye Water company of West Asheville, of which R. P. Hayes is president, has instituted condemnation proceedings for rights of way for additional pipe lines and for a location of a reservoir against William Johnston, Jr., R. P. Johnston, Harold E. Johnston, J. K. Green and the Southern railway.

In the proceedings it is set forth that the company is supplying water to the residents of West Asheville, that it owns a valuable water shed on which are several springs and that it is necessary that it acquire rights of way for a pipe line and a reservoir site on the lands of the above named parties, that it has attempted to purchase the rights of way and reservoir site and is unable to do so, and asks that a right of way ten feet wide be condemned for the pipe line and about one-fourth of an acre for the reservoir, and that the right of way to the reservoir may be used for the purpose of a road for hauling material for the construction of the reservoir.

Supreme Court Makes Ruling of Importance to Secret Orders.

Raleigh, Dec. 22.—A ruling of special interest to Odd Fellows and other secret orders of the state, having sick benefits, is just made by the Supreme court in Kelly vs. Tremont lodge of Odd Fellows, Mason county, the court holding that while the law of the order prescribes that all disputes about sick benefits shall be settled in the tribunals of the order, where a party stands on legal rights, claiming that the lodge is indebted to him, the courts are clearly not ousted of jurisdiction. Also that while the law of the order prescribes that the sick benefit is for the brother or his immediate family, an executrix can, as in this case, maintain a suit for recovery.
