San Francisco, Sept. 2.-The Southrn Pacific Railroad company through fulius Kruttschnitt, vice president and director of maintenance and operation of the Harriman lines, absoutely rejected yesterday a demand or recognition of the federation of hop employes, comprising five shop raft unions and 25,000 men.

That such recognition, with its im-plications, would hamper the com-onny in performing its duty to the public was the position taken by its fficials. Union leaders asked for it n grounds of economy and expedidon and admittedly because of a feelng that greater centralization of cap-tal and power made corresponding entralization among various unions esirable.

The unions involved had asked their eneral officers for permission to rant recognition of the federation. A conference lasting over three tours was terminated by Mr. Kruttchnitt's final answer and following t the union representatives, soberaced, went into session by themselves o consider the strike vote which they nay accept as binding or may reject, efusing to sanction a strike. Following the conference Mr. Krutt-chnitt issued the following state-

"In the conference the question o he benefit to accrue to both the company and the men from a feder-ation was fully presented by the inernational officers, and the officers of the railroad company explained at ength the embarrassment that the company would experience in perorming its public functions if hantered by a committee vested with ufficient power to control or partialcontrol its operations,"
