BEST GRAIN CROPS EVER IN CHEROKEE COUNTY

Fine Corn Crops in Valley River—Wheat Crop Was Excellent, Also.

The best corn crop ever raised on Valley river is what everybody says who has seen it, says the Murphy Scout. W. N. Cooper estimates that he will gather 5000 bushels on 150 acres on his farm above Marble. "We are told that W. F. Walker of Andrews estimates that he will gather 20,000 bushels of corn on his several farms. The Messrs. Brittain in East Murphy will gather from 60 to 80 bushels to the acre. The Messrs. Dickey will gather 5000 bushels of corn on the Mission farm on Peach and 2000 bushels on their Nolichucky farm, near Lenoir. We suppose that in other sections of the county the same conditions exist, and we feel safe in saying that the best wheat and corn crops not to mention the other stuff, ever harvested in the history of Cherokee county will be gathered this year, all of which looks good to yours truly."

SELF-SUPPORTING ROOF OF CONCRETE

Concrete in Almost Every Form in Construction of the New Hotel.

Never in the city has concrete been used to such an extent or in such a variety of ways as in the construction of the Green-Lange hotel. It is literally a "concrete" building, as it is popularly called. To those who have been noting the progress of construction of the building, many novel methods of working concrete have been presented. It is to be seen in almost every shape and size and always it is accompanied by the reinforcement of steel.

With the exception of the frame and tiled concrete-flooring, the entire concrete work has been under the supervision of A. M. Goodlake, who has shown much ingenuity and resourcefulness in moulding the stuff to his liking.

To begin with the frame is a concrete monolith, with steel rods and beams and concrete, combined in an inextricable mass, and even in the construction of the blocks, with which the interstices are filled, small wires are used to keep them from cracking.

But the most interesting work that has been done in this line is the construction of a self-supporting roof over the court yard, between the two great wings of the building. To build this roof, which is at the same time a floor, it was necessary that wooden centering or supports be used to hold up the concrete until it had set. The form was made so that it slopes slightly toward the center from all sides and there is a water pipe to drain the roof. Numberless steel rods of various sizes were laid along the support, while provision was made for concrete beams, in which were imbedded railroad irons. There were forms for skylights too, with even the coping provided for, and the bolts for fastening down the lights, while through the centering run loops of wire, by which the metal lathe will be fastened to the roof on the under side.

When the concrete has set the props will be knocked out and the centering removed, leaving the roof to support itself.

ASHEVILLE MOTOR CLUB WILL PUBLISH BOOKLET

American Automobile Association Asks for Information About Sunset Road.

The automobile road to Sunset mountain, recently opened by E. W. Grove, is attracting outside attention. At the meeting of the Asheville Motor club last night, a letter from the American Automobile association was read, asking for data about the road and for the best routes by which Asheville can be reached, so that the information can be published.

The club decided also to print booklets in which will be given descriptions of the roads leading to Asheville from various points, and of many beautiful drives in and around the city. It is thought that they will be much appreciated by those who are not familiar with the roads in this section.

The members discussed the proposition of building an automobile road to Mountain Meadows inn and the president was instructed to confer with the proprietor of the inn about it.
