# RICHMOND CHOSEN FOR NEXT MEETING

## Statement Concerning the Attitude of Governors on State Rights Question.

Spring Lake, N. J., Sept. 16.—The third annual governors' conference came to an unexpected close here late yesterday after the conferees had waited two hours to hear Governor DeLoach of New York, who was delayed in reaching Spring Lake. Although the program was to have extended through today, illness and inability to attend on the part of several scheduled speakers led to the discovery that there would be no matter claiming the attention of the gathering and the idea of holding a session was abandoned. Fifteen governors who met at the afternoon session yesterday held what they termed an extended meeting. Governor Shafroth of Colorado discussed the state prison law and other reforms in his state, and Governor Tennyson of Pennsylvania, likewise told of reform in his state.

"This," he said in conclusion, "deserves a better name, perhaps, than the governors' conference. This is the ancient and amalgamated order of governors, the governors' union."

Richmond is selected. Governor Augustus E. Willson of Kentucky thanked the committee of arrangements for its work and the conference adjourned to meet at Richmond, in December, 1912.

Nineteen of the 29 governors, who attended the meeting, left during the night of the 15th. Those remaining over night at Spring Lake were Governors O'Neil, McGovern, Carey, Hawley, Sprey, Gilchrist, Vessey, Cruce and Stubbs.

Contrary to general expectation the conference voted down in executive session the motion to appoint William George Jordan, who has served as secretary three years, permanent secretary. Instead, it was decided to leave the selection of a secretary to the executive committee.

Uniform Divorce Law. Governor Gilchrist of Florida announced that the executive committee had agreed to place foremost on next year's program a discussion on the advisability of having a uniform divorce law. "No man would run away with the presidency of the United States," said Governor Harmon, "and Ohio, when asked if he was a candidate for the democratic presidential nomination. When asked for a more definite announcement, Governor Harmon replied that he did not consider it in keeping with the proprieties of the governors' conference to drag in personal political affairs. He had no intention of the conference as a candidate for any office, but to confer with his colleagues, and thought that it would be bad taste to refer to political matters upon his departure.

The governor left for Knoxville where he will address the Appalachian convention. Before departing for Knoxville, Governor Harmon prepared a statement concerning the newly appointed states right committee. "The states right committee, as to States' Rights.

"In view of an apparent misunderstanding by some of the action of the conference yesterday, it is deemed advisable that a statement should be made as to its exact nature and purpose.

"As the decision of the United States Circuit court in what are known as the Minnesota cases, has the effect that the state of Minnesota had no authority to regard railroad rates within its own borders because interstate commerce was thereby affected and as other cases involving the same question in other states would soon come before the supreme court of the United States for decision, the conference considered it advisable that a committee should be appointed to see that the state's side is properly protected and presented to the supreme court.

"The committee expects to deal only with the legal side of this controversy, and the action taken yesterday was one of only ordinary precaution. Every state in the union is equally and vitally interested in the decision of this question, and it is deemed advisable that a committee should be organized to regulate its own internal commerce, would be destroyed by an adverse decision. We expect to ascertain what cases will first be considered by the supreme court in which this question will be decided and if it is deemed advisable we will seek leave to present to the court a brief argument in support of the right of the state to regulate commerce wholly within its borders."
