AGAIN AFTER WILSON Massachusetts Prohibitionists in Convention Criticize His Post in the Brewers' Congress.

Boston, Sept. 22.—Condemnation of senator Wilson of the department of agriculture for holding the position of honorary president of the International Brewers' congress and criticism of President Taft and Secretary of State P. C. Knox, furnished a theme for speeches at the state convention yesterday of the prohibition party.

The president was criticized for permitting a cabinet officer to hold such a position, while the secretary of state assumed the antagonism of the prohibitionists by sending out notices to consuls in foreign countries calling attention to the forthcoming brewers' congress in Chicago.
