**TWO CONVENTIONS MAY BE SECURED**

**Asheville Has Chance at Highway Association and Fertilizer Manufacturers.**

**FORMER IS TO MEET IN RICHMOND NOV. 20**

Asheville Business Men Might Help by Writing to Fertilizer Executive Committee.

On account of stress of work, N. Buckner, secretary of the board of trade, who was named as a delegate to the Waterways convention which convenes in Richmond today, was not able to attend and Mr. Buckner stated that so far as he knows no one is attending from Asheville. He said, however, that the convention of the American Association for Highway Improvement meets in Richmond November 20, and he is going to try to attend this as there is a chance of getting this association to hold its next convention in Asheville. Mr. Buckner has received a letter from Mr. Pennypacker, secretary of that organization, saying that Asheville is being favorably considered by the officers and it is thought that this city stands as good a chance as any other.

Another convention which the board of trade is working to get next year is that of the National Association of Fertilizer Manufacturers. In the journal of this organization, published by W. W. Brown of Atlanta, there are two pages of comment on the next place of meeting in which Asheville holds a prominent and favorable place. It is suggested that if some of the Asheville business men should write to the members of the executive committee it might help to turn their attention this way. W. W. Hubbard of Chesterton, Md., is the chairman and W. C. Sadler of Nashville is the secretary. Other members of the executive committee are Charles Ellis of Savannah, C. H. Dempwolf of York, Pa., J. T. Welch of Columbus, O., William Prescott of Cleveland, O., and Parker Fleming of Augusta.

The secretary of the Association of General Passenger and Ticket Agents writes that the next meeting will be held in Seattle.

**INVITATION'S SENT FOR OCTOBER 24**

**The Meeting Here to Perfect Organization of W. N. C. Mutual Interests.**

Through the board of trade last night were sent out numbers of circular letters, invitations to the different towns of the section to send delegates to the meeting which is to be held here October 24 for the purpose of perfecting a permanent organization, which will be in the interest of the development of western North Carolina. At the top of the letter is printed in large type "A Greater Western North Carolina" and with the invitation is the printed speech of President Finley of the Southern railway, who delivered the principal address at the Western North Carolina banquet recently held at the Battery Park hotel and at which the various communities were represented.

It was then decided to hold another meeting for the purpose above stated, October 24, at the county court house. At that time the purpose of the organization will also be discussed and a committee will report to the meeting a plan of organization and also plans for the advertising and development of the country.

It is asked that the committee on arrangements be advised of the names of those who expect to attend the meeting.

**CITY NEWS**

An undertaking in appeal by some of the plaintiffs in the case of *Patillo vs. Lytle* has been filed in the office clerk of court. The case was decided in favor of the defendants at the last term of court.

Two summonses for relief were filed in Clerk of the Court Erwin's office today, one in the case of A. H. Carrier vs. Bull-Crocker Lumber company and another in the case of Frank S. Vaughn vs. A. B. and Charles C. Case.

The McDowell county fair opens at Marion Thursday and will continue through Saturday. Much interest is being taken in the fair and the McDowell county fair did much to help with the success of the fair here. Mr. Collocott stated that there would be about 800 yards to pave, and if he were allowed the blocks, he thought the space might be paved for about \$1000. The city fathers have not decided yet whether to do this and in any event would have to await the decision of the Southern company, as to the paving of the freight yard.

The John Deering company, which had a display of farm implements this year, has asked for twice the space for the next fair and signifies the intention of shipping a carload of machinery for the purpose. A man who did not exhibit has asked for 12 stalls for cattle and stated that he would fill them with high bred stock.
