JUDGE BOYD DECIDES FOR THE HINWASSEE CO.

Government Gives Notice of Appeal—Federal Court Adjudges to Jan. 8.

The United States Circuit court adjourned this morning until January 8, after the case of United States vs. Hinwassee Lumber company, involving the ownership of 5000 acres of land in some of the western counties had been concluded. As stated yesterday, the jury in the case failed to agree on the issue presented to them and Judge Boyd withdrew it from them and decided it himself. His decision, which was made late yesterday afternoon, was in favor of the defendant and the government gave notice of appeal to the United States Court of Appeals. The case has occupied about one week in the hearing. Much documentary evidence has been introduced and many witnesses examined. The main issue of the case concerned the location of the land in litigation.

Purchaser of Ticket at Palace or Theatro Gets Coupon Admitting to the Other.

The management of the Theatro and Palace theaters has made arrangements by which the purchaser of a ticket at one of these theaters will be given a coupon by which he can be admitted to the other theater, during next week, beginning Monday. That is, if a ticket is bought at the Palace theater, the purchaser will be given a coupon which will admit him to the Theatro on the same day the ticket is bought, and if he buys the ticket at the Theatro, he will be admitted by coupon to the Palace theater, giving two admissions for the price of one ticket.

CHARLOTTE WANTS IT

Asks Asheville to Help Secure 1912 Convention of Highway Association.

Secretary Buckner of the board of trade this morning received a letter from the secretary of the Greater Charlotte club, stating that Charlotte is making an effort to get the 1912 convention of the American Association for Highway Improvement, which meets in Richmond in a few days. The letter said that Mayor Bland, Major Hemphill of the Charlotte Observer and President Knuyter of the club are going to attend the convention and it is desired that Asheville give Charlotte help in getting the convention by writing letters to the officers of the organization.

As Asheville hopes to get the convention herself, it would hardly be expected that much aid will be given to Charlotte, unless it is realized that Asheville stands no chance.

CITY NEWS

An answer was filed in the office of the clerk of Superior court today in the case of Henry Wall vs. Tennessee and North Carolina Railroad company in which the defendant denies the principal allegations that were set forth in the complaint.

Among the many improvements in train service recently inaugurated by the Southern railway is that effective November 22 trains numbers 17 and 18, now running between Richmond and Keyville, Va., will be extended to operate between Richmond and Danville. This was announced yesterday by President W. W. Finley.

The fact that Biltmore postoffice was designated as one of the postal savings bank offices was announced several days ago. The office will be ready to accept deposits on December 5, according to the order of the postmaster general and J. B. Greenwood, the present clerk of the office, will have charge of the savings department.

This afternoon at Riverside park the football team of the Bingham school meets the university of Chattanooga aggregation. It is held that the two teams are very well matched and a good game is expected. Bingham has a good average team this year and has had more than usual success in the games already played this season.

The Postal Telegraph-Cable company, in order to keep up with the growth of their business and to provide better facilities in the wholesale district, opened a branch office yesterday afternoon in the Glen Rock hotel. This office will be under the jurisdiction of the main office at No. 1 Haywood street.

In a well played game of football yesterday afternoon in the grounds of the local school the Asheville school defeated the Mooney school of Harriman by the score of 9 to 6. Mooney generally has a strong team and nearly always is in the championship race of the preparatory schools and the victory of the Asheville school was hardly expected even by its most ardent well wishers.

The case of Buckner vs. the South and Western Railroad and the Carolina company, in which the plaintiff was asking for damages in the sum of \$10,000, was non-suited in Superior court this morning. Notice of appeal from the judgment was given by the plaintiff. There was no other business of importance before the court and a recess was taken at 1 o'clock until 10 o'clock Monday morning.

The Farmers Union Supply company, which was incorporated several months ago with some of the members of the Farmers' union as the principal stockholders, is now receiving some of its stock, which is being unloaded at the store room of the company near the depot. In the building formerly occupied by the Jita-Cola company. E. B. Stradley was elected as the manager of the store and is now in charge.

Tomorrow afternoon at the usual hour Dr. J. W. Walker will speak at the Y. M. C. M. L. E. class at 4 o'clock. The membership is steadily increasing. All men are invited. In the near future a light comedy will be given at the Y. M. C. L. for the benefit of the association. All those who have not paid in full their pledges on building fund are asked to notify the general secretary when it would be convenient to call and collect.

The Builders' exchange of Asheville, which was organized some days ago with J. C. McPherson as president, has leased the two upper floors of number 10 Church street to be used as the headquarters and sample rooms of the organization and it is planned to have the new quarters in readiness for the next meeting Tuesday night. It has not been decided whether the offices will be opened permanently or who will be in charge. It is the intention of the organizers to make the exchange serve its members somewhat as the merchants association does its members.

Police court held another short session this morning. Alexander Smith, charged with retailing, whose case came up from yesterday's docket, was found not guilty, as the prosecuting witness said that he had bought the whiskey from an older negro. Pink Simpson, colored, was fined \$15 and the costs for an assault on another negro who, he said, owed him either 65 or 85 cents, and he was trying to collect it. He was advised to use some other method next time. Wade Lawson, white, was sent to the county jail for 15 days for cruelty to animals. The charge was that he had driven a lame horse to a loaded wagon, after the officers had told him to take the animal home.
