ASSOCIATION MADE PERMANENT

Will Be Incorporated—Election of Officers, Plan of Organization, Etc.

Special to The Gazette-News.

Hendersonville, Nov. 23.—At an enthusiastic meeting of the directors of the Greater Western North Carolina Association this morning, the organization was made permanent, a charter was adopted and the officers and permanent directors were elected. There was a good attendance, seven counties being represented, and there was evidence of a determination to pull together for the best interests of the section to be served by the organization, especially that portion of western North Carolina known as the "Land of the Sky." The charter is considered very broad and contemplates the development and advertisement of this part of the state. The association is a non-stock organization but is to be incorporated, and the money to carry out the work is to be raised by subscription, donation or otherwise. The directors hold another meeting this afternoon to adopt by-laws and to discuss the details of the organization, especially the financial end of it.

W. E. Breeze, jr., of Brevard was elected president and the other officers are W. A. Smith of Hendersonville, vice president; F. W. Miller of Waynesville, secretary; George S. Powell, of Asheville, treasurer. Each county is to be allowed three votes; but any county may have as many directors as it chooses. The directors are to be subject to confirmation by the several counties.

Three directors were chosen for Buncombe, but these can be changed or confirmed or added to at the discretion of the civic organizations. They are H. W. Plummer, D. Harris, and N. Buckner.

The following directors were chosen for Haywood: P. H. Ray, J. W. Reed, G. W. Dowling, B. J. Sloan, F. W. Miller, J. Bat. Smathers and others. For Jackson county: J. B. Enaley, D. J. Harris, W. E. Moore. For Madison county: J. J. Redmon, Plato Ebbs, James H. White. For Polk county: P. T. Ballinger, W. T. Lindsey, J. C. Fisher. For Transylvania county: W. E. Breeze, jr., J. Silverstein, R. B. Wilson, J. T. Gash. For Henderson county: J. H. Staton, W. A. Smith, G. Garlington, M. L. Shipman, F. F. Patton, S. Lee Morris, C. A. Schenck, W. F. Edwards, C. V. Shepherd, and others.

The organization was formed for an unlimited period of time, to endure as long as it is needed. One of the most important purposes contemplated is the securing of industries for the several counties.
