# KELP OF PACIFIC COAST TO FURNISH OUR POTASH

It Is Expected to Yield a Million Tons, Worth \$40,000,-000, Every Year.

Washington, Dec. 22,-The United States will not have to depend on Germany much longer for its potash with which to make fertilizer, Secretary of Agriculture Wilson says.

"In the near future the United States should be able not only to supply its own needs, but also to export a considerable amount of pot-

ish," he said. The principal source of American ootash, the experts of the agricultural department report, will be in the kell or seaweed of the Pacific coast. This plant extracts potash saits from sea water and from 25 to 35 per cent of its weight is potassium chloride. The Pacific coast should yield annually about 1,000,000 tons, worth \$40,000,-000. In addition to the potash, kelp contains iodine and many other by-products which may "more than pay the manufacturing expenses, leaving the polassium chloride free of cost." The investigators report cattle food
