ABUSE BY A CONDUCTOR DAMAGE SUIT'S BASIS

The Misses Penland of Candler Sue Southern for Aggregate Sum of \$3000.

In the complaints to the suit which the Penland sisters of Candler are bringing against the Southern Railway, some interesting allegations are contained. Three sisters are suing the defendant company for an aggregate of \$10,000 contending that they were abused on a train by the company's conductor, L. F. Wynn.

The complaint recites that the sisters, Misses Emma, Bessie and Toby, boarded the train at Candler for Emma; that the conductor failed to stop the train at Emma, and they called his attention to it. It is alleged that the conductor cursed, insulted and abused them while they were endeavoring to get off and pushed them. Miss Emma and Miss Bessie are asking for \$2000 each. Miss Toby asks for \$4000. She charges that the pushing of the conductor resulted in twisting her ankle. They are represented by Zeb F. Curtis.

Debs Says Taft Is Beaten.

Torre Haute, Ind., Sept. 18.—Eugene V. Debs, socialist candidate for president, who arrived home from a three weeks' campaigning trip to the Pacific, returning by way of the central southern states, says the progressive spirit prevails in all parties in the 18 states he visited.

"There is no doubt so far as Roosevelt and Taft are concerned that the latter is entirely out of the race," said he. "The old Bourbon democracy of the south with its prejudices and the sole republican party with its office-holding bosses are becoming mere shells. The democratic solid south will be shaken this year as it never was before at an election."
