BIG DOCKET TRIED IN POLICE COURT TODAY

Judgment Entered in Assault, Larceny, Etc., Cases—Doings of Day.

In Police court this morning Judge Adams faced a large docket, the session lasting until 11:30 o'clock and there being, six assault cases, three larceny, seven gambling cases and five other cases of minor importance. Berry Hensley, charged with assault on Allen Taylor, pleaded former conviction, and his case was dismissed. Eugene Martin was found not guilty of assaulting his wife.

John Nichols, charged with assaulting Willie Colter—both negro boys—was found guilty, and judgment suspended on payment of costs; and the same judgment was entered in the case of Willie Colter against John Nichols.

Allen Burkan, alias Allen Moore, was charged with the larceny of a pair of trousers, the property of found and Stepp, probable cause was found and he was bound over to Superior court under a \$200 bond. Under the name of Allen Moore he was arranged for the larceny of a pair of trousers from N. G. Gillespie, and the case was continued until tomorrow morning. In the case of Ed. Young, charged with larceny, probable cause was found, and he was bound to Superior court. Ernest Stuman was taxed with \$10 and the costs for assaulting Joseph Edwards and \$4 and the costs for being drunk in the city.

Howard White was found not guilty of an assault on Bob Pressley. Ben Morris, W. I. Yoder and Will Morris were fined \$5 and the costs each, for indulging in a game of chance. Will Morris appealing with bond fixed at \$100. The following young men were found guilty of the same charge: Charley Sneed, Bill Grant, George Want, and Jack Blacklock.

Ada Early was found not guilty of disorderly conduct. John Seay was found not guilty of driving an automobile in a dangerous and reckless manner; and Jesse Crook was declared not guilty of driving an automobile on the wrong side of the street.

BANK STOCK AUCTION

Sale of 288 Shares of Those Who Failed to Pay Assessment, at About 60.

At the court house at noon today there were sold at public auction 288 shares of stock of the American National bank, the property of those who had failed to pay the 40 per cent. recently assessed against the stock of the bank, the stock having been placed on sale for the assessment. It was sold in several lots and brought 60 per cent. The biggest lot was bought in by the bank. This was 197 shares listed in the name of John H. Carter, and the price bid was \$11,500. R. A. Lynch bought 75 shares for \$4550.

Other successful bidders were Dr. P. R. Moale, one share, \$63; William Redwood, ten shares, \$402; Mrs. Henry Redwood, five shares, \$202. It is understood that after the sale was over Mr. Lynch offered Mr. Jenkins \$11,500, a profit of \$200, for the block of stock bought in by the bank, which Mr. Jenkins refused.
