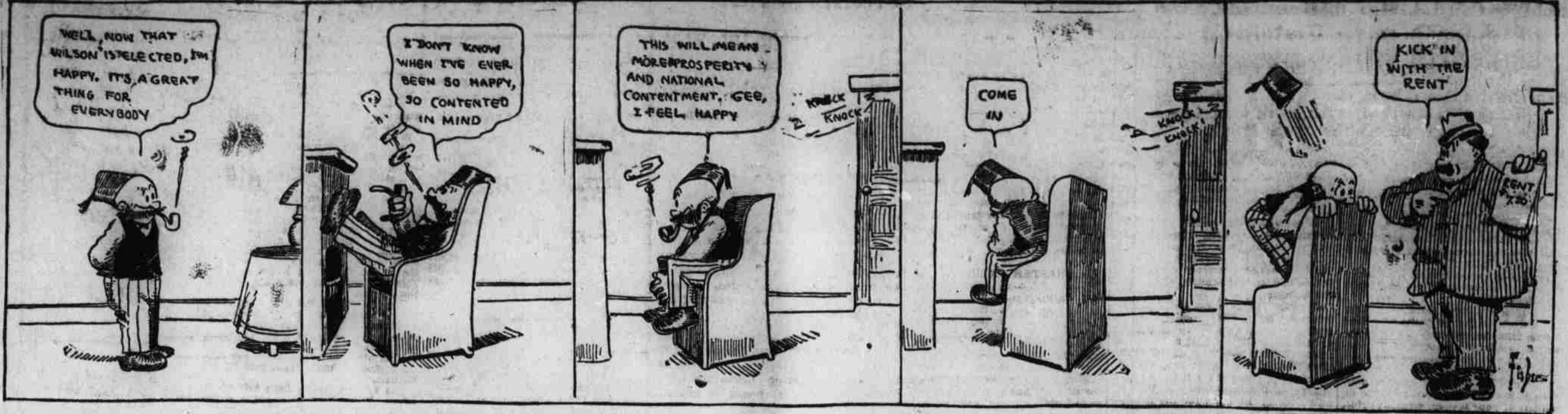

Long Missing Physician a Suicide.

 Middleboro, Mass., Nov. 12.—Relatives of Dr. Chilton A. Gardener, of Swansea, formerly a member of the staff of the post graduate hospital of New York, have claimed a decomposed body found a few days ago on the shore of a pond here, satisfied that it is the body of Gardener. The man committed suicide by shooting himself in the head. Gardener disappeared from the New York hospital last July.
