General Conditions (Past 24 Hours).

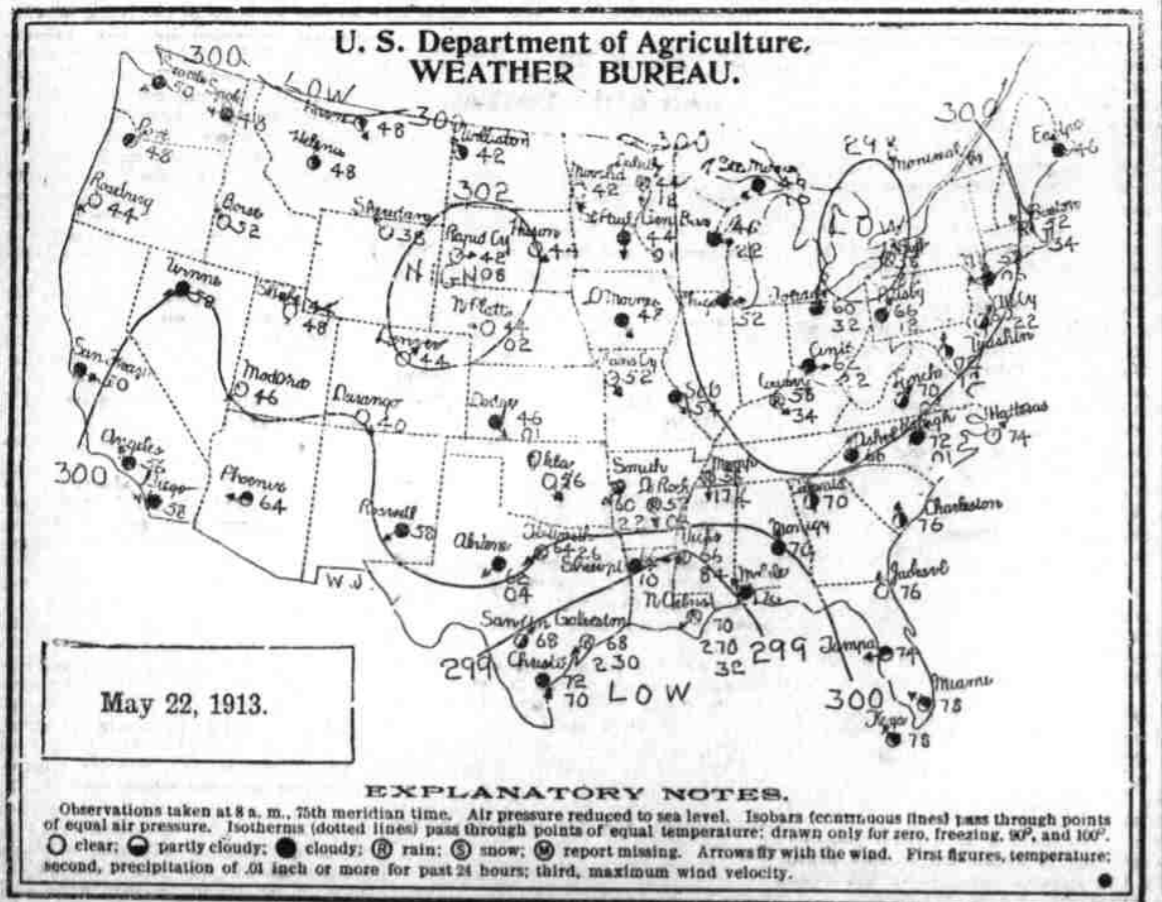
