LITERARY SOCIETY MEETING TONIGHT

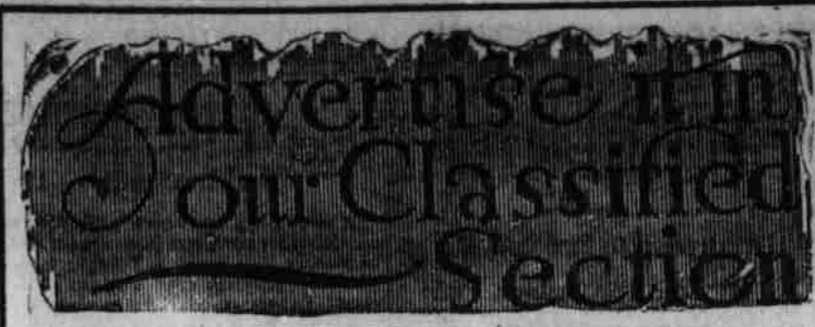
The second meeting of the Y. M. C. A. Literary society will be held in the association building tonight at 7:30 o'clock.
