CASE SETTLED AFTER 23 YEARS' LITIGATION

New York, April 20.—The case of Donnelly against McArdle in the courts for 23 years, is settled at last, and Michael Donnelly, the plaintiff, will receive the \$48,000 judgment for which he has spent the best years of his life and about \$186,000 to obtain. The suit grew out of a business transaction between Mr. Donnelly and his brother-in-law, Patrick J. McArdle.

New Haven, Conn., April 20.—Official announcement of the arrangements for the annual Yale-Harvard regatta at New London has been made here. The "varsity eight oared race" will be held on the water at 4:30 p. m. on June 19.

Decision as to whether the minor "varsity race" shall be between four oared or eight oared boats is to be made by the crew captains before April 20.

Washington, April 20.—At the request of Representative Aswell the American Red Cross has ordered the dispatch of clothing, provisions and seed to 28 families—about 150 persons—whose farm have been inundated for the third time in three years by the Red river near Marksville, La.

Washington, April 20.—Appointment of Dr. Samuel E. Lewis, of Washington, as commissioner to supervise the marking of Confederate graves in national cemeteries and at federal military stations as provided by congress was announced today. Dr. Lewis was a Confederate surgeon.

NEWS NOTES FROM THE STATE UNIVERSITY

Six Men Research Bureau Considers Most "Conspicuous In the World."

 Chapel Hill, April 20.—Numerous and varied are the inquiries mailed the bureau of extension of the Universities mailed the bureau of extension of the University of North Carolina from many sections of the state. The people are taking advantage of the sources of information afforded by the State University through its extension agency, guidance in educational affairs and enlightenment on everyday subjects being sought through this medium. The information bureau has lately received an inquiry from a citizen of the state asking for the names of the six most conspicuous men of the world today. The reasons why these world-citizens hold such a position in the minds of their fellow men were asked to be stated. These names and brief reasons for their world-wide recognition were forwarded the inquisitive citizen: Woodrow Wilson, as president of the United States and ranked as one of the nation's greatest executives; Bernard Shaw, foremost in the world of letters for reasons of his literary talents and criticisms; Andrew Carnegie, a man of world business interests and whose amassed wealth is being used in the cause of world philanthropy; Lloyd George, English statesman, whose economic reforms for the benefit of the average man have attracted world attention; Theodore Roosevelt, whose personality is so dynamic as to fix the attention of all men, and John R. Mott, of the Student Volunteer movement, as an organizer of a world movement for the evangelization of the world.

"Foods and Foolishness" was the theme that Dr. Woods Hutchinson, noted physician, author, and lecturer, presented to a university audience in a lecture in Gerrard Hall this week. Wholesome food and fresh air were declared the tonics and preventives of the ill and diseases of the future American citizen, while drugs and trashy food-stuffs were rated as dangerous enemies to the welfare of health. Dr. Hutchinson asserted that the use of drugs had fallen off enormously lately in comparison with their use of thirty years ago, the decrease being a third percentage. Patient medicines and breakfast foods were extolled by the distinguished American physician. He declared that the nutrition contained by many patient medicines, proclaimed by their manufacturers as restoratives of broken health, represented little more real value toward the upbuilding of a person than the label on the bottle containing the medicine. The physician's hostility to breakfast foods was of the negative sort, since he maintained that they possessed little nutritive value, though not injurious.

Acting President Edward K. Graham announces the selection of Dr. John Dewey, professor of philosophy in Columbia University, as the speaker to deliver the McNair lectures for the college of 1914-1915.
