

"Semi-official reports by wireless from Tampico state that the forces of General Cosio Robello entered the town of San Luis Potosi Friday after a sanguinary battle. General Robello belongs to the command of General Pablo Gonzales, who yesterday also drove the rebels from Rodriguez station, whilh is about 65 miles east of San Luis Potosi.

"Captain Niles of the Carranga aviation corps and Major Salinas, his chief, flying a French monoplane above the field of battle, reported that the Carranza forces were west of Apam 60 miles from Mexico City. However, there is still a large ber of rebels resisting General Obregon. The movement on Puebla from Amozoc is complete and the active bombardment of that town is expected to begin in the morning."
