### When Delaware Produced Iron.

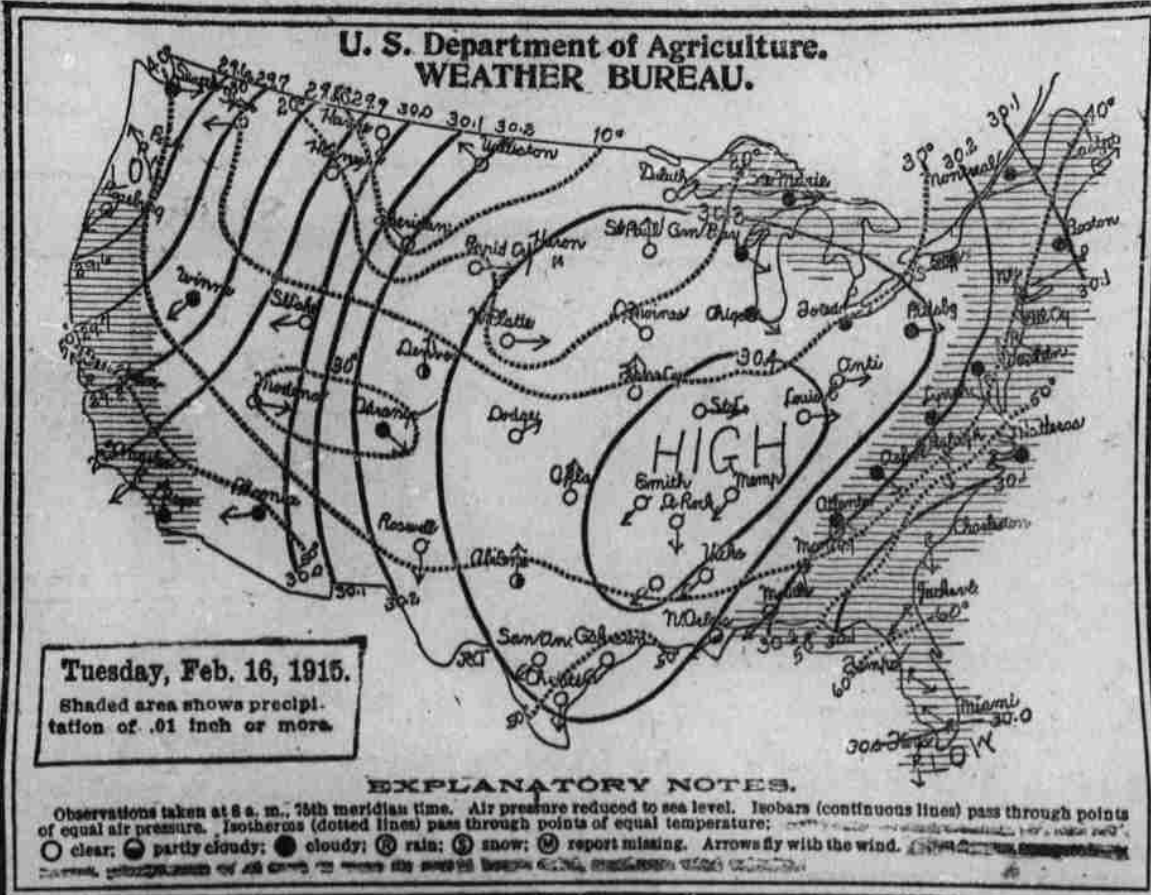
