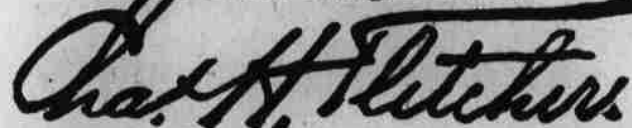

Dr. Jenkins will begin the first division of the series tomorrow morning, the Crisis of the Cross, subjects: 1, The Fall and the Curse; 2, The New Birth; 3, Conviction for Sin; 4, Repentance; 5, Saving Faith; 6, The Good Confession; 7, Justification; 8, The Death of Jesus Christ, What and Why; 9, The Story of the Cross; 10, The Cross Unveiled in the Memorial Supper; 12, The Experience of the Cross; 13, The Manifest Call of Grace; 14, The Inevitability of the Cross; 15, The Ultimate Meaning of the Cross; 16, The Glorious Destiny of the Redeemed.

Dr. Oliver M. Fletcher, of Brooklyn, N. Y., will preach at the evening service, Dr. Jenkins having been called away to deliver his sermon on "The Present War and Its Lessons" at Clyde, N. C.

Rev. F. W. Stanton, pastor of the First Methodist Episcopal church, will illustrate his sermon on Sunday night with his newly installed stereopticon and a fine set of colored slides. The subject of the sermon will be "Joseph, the Finest Young Man of History." Over 50 beautiful pictures of scenes in Palestine and Egypt as they actually appear today, will be used to trace the life of Joseph from his boyhood to old age. Much interest has been shown in these illustrated sermons, and the church has been crowded. A large audience is expected tomorrow night.

Mr. Stanton announces as the theme of his morning sermon, "The Old and New Testament's Philosophy of a Change of Heart."
