WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS TO SECURE YOUNG GIRL Following the filing of a writ of habeas corpus by Belle Haney late yesterday afternoon, Judge Long in Superior court ordered Chief of Police L. E. Perry to produce Daisy Fore, age 15, before the court on September 27, which is the day Superior court for criminal cases convene here. It is alleged the girl was placed in the children's home here in 1904 at the death of the mother. In 1905 she was apprenticed to Tom and Belle Nash until she was 18 years of age. It is further claimed that the Nashes removed to South Carolina and took the girl with them and that because of cruel treatment she left and was arrested here on advice of the Nashes. She was temporarily placed in the custody of the Haneyas.

MANY ACTIVITIES ARE PLANNED BY BOARD

Lieutenants Named to Aid Chiefs in Financial Campaign of City.

A. C. Goodman has announced the selection of William Farr as his lieutenant and J. Bayliss Rector named W. R. Patterson for a similar position to aid these generals in the board of trade campaign.

The directors of the board have issued a call to representatives of all the churches civic bodies and fraternal organizations to attend a meeting at which a community calendar will be arranged. By this means each organization will know in advance before any movement is launched in the city and conflicting programs will be avoided.

Another plan announced looks to the establishment of a convention and tourist bureau with necessary subdivisions. One division will promote conventions and another will see that they receive adequate advertisement and proper accommodations and courtesies while they are guests of Asheville.

A members' council or round table will be organized, each business or profession naming its own representative. Group meetings of this body will be held during the afternoons of next week.

In outlining a program of work the referendum system of securing ideas and suggestions will be employed.
