A. I. RUBY SUFFERS PARALYTIC STROKE

Singer For Baptist Home Mis-
sion Board Is In Serious
Condition Here.

Just as he was preparing to leave
his home at No. 3 Baird street, Thurs-
day afternoon, to take a train for
Aberdeen, Texas, where he was to as-
sist in an evangelistic campaign, Al-
tha Ira Ruby suffered a stroke of
paralysis on the left side and is today
reported to be in a very serious con-
dition.

Mr. Ruby was completely paralyzed
on the left side and has been rational
only at times since then. He is at-
tended by Dr. Reeves, who stated to-
day that Mr. Ruby's condition is very
serious.

Mr. Ruby came to Asheville several
years ago and was for some time di-
rector of the music at the First Bap-
tist church. He resigned this work
about one year ago and since then
has been connected with the Baptist
home mission board as an evangelistic
singer.

He has helped in many revivals in
different parts of the south since tak-
ing his new position and is widely
known among Baptists of the country.
He returned to his home the early
part of this week from a campaign
in Savannah and was apparently in
the best of health. He was preparing
to leave yesterday for Texas when he
suffered the attack.

MISS WRIGHT SUFFERS STROKE OF PARALYSIS

a serious condition. The stroke came
without any previous illness, it is
