TAKING OF GERMANS FROM SHIP DETAILED

New York, Jan. 29.—Details of the removal of three Germans from the American steamer Zaccapa at Kingston on her outward voyage were told when the steamer arrived here yesterday. The two men were sent to a detention camp, while the woman was permitted to remain at Kingston.
