INTERESTING TALKS ON GARDENING

Committees to Be Named to Secure Vacant Lots For Cultivation.

Home gardening work and its value to the school students and to the community were the subjects of an instructive address by Dr. A. S. Wheeler yesterday afternoon at the Y. M. C. A. at the meeting called to consider plans for continuing the movement in this city.

Dr. Wheeler spoke from experience, having taught a boys' class as far back as twenty-five years ago. Secretary Buckner of the board of trade compared the gardening movement to the farm demonstration carried on in this county under the direction of E. D. Weaver. Mr. Durban spoke on beautifying the city with flowers. E. D. Johnson, chairman of the garden supervisors, expressed appreciation for co-operation given him, Mrs. Charles A. Webb, Mrs. Rogers, Mrs. Fletcher and others took part in the discussion that followed.

Mrs. Webb was named chairman of the publicity committee. At the next meeting committees on vacant lots and on addresses to be made at the schools, will be appointed. Those who have vacant lots to offer for cultivation are asked to communicate with the board of trade.

IMPROVEMENTS AT CENTRAL CHURCH

Extensive improvements are being made at Central Methodist church on Church street, under the supervision of Arch Nichols, chairman of the custodial committee of the church. The yard has been regraded and re-turfed and the Billmore nurseries are planting shrubbery, and setting out a hedge along the sidewalk the entire distance of the church and parsonage property. New concrete walks are being laid to the pastor's study, the main entrance and the parsonage. A new walk also is being constructed to the primary department, making it easier for the younger children to reach their rooms. A coping about six inches high has been placed along the sidewalk and the shrubbery, thus giving the yard a much better appearance. All the outside wood work of the church is being painted. These improvements will add greatly to the appearance of the church and church property.

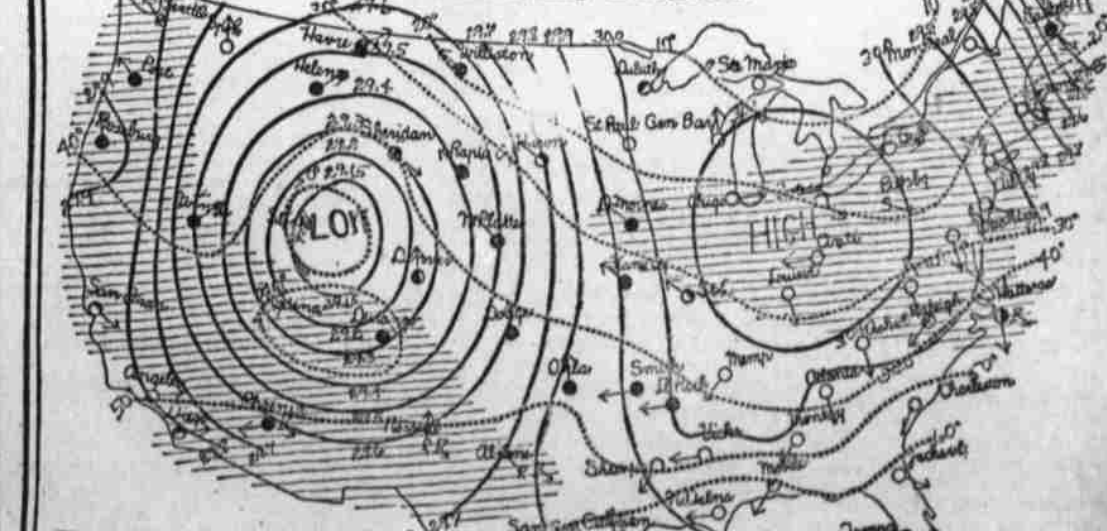

The disturbances that was over the Ohio valley Wednesday morning is now moving off the New England coast and it has been attended by rains in the lower lake region, the Ohio valley and the north and middle Atlantic states and gales on the coast. The western storm has developed great energy and has caused rains in the Pacific states, the plateau section, Colorado, New Mexico and western Texas. FIREMEN CALLED TWICE TO SAME RESIDENCE

Two fires at the residence of Mrs. V. B. McRae, at No. 230 Cumberland avenue, caused each time by an overheated cooking range, were extinguished last night by the local fire department before any great damage was done. The first alarm was turned in shortly after 9 o'clock and when the firemen arrived they found a small smoldering blaze under the kitchen range, which they extinguished immediately. The engine returned and shortly before 11 o'clock another alarm was sent in from the same residence. The fire, it is stated, had been rebuilt in the range this causing the second fire, which was extinguished with slight damage.

GALLOWAY DESTROYS FOUR DISTILLERIES

Within the last week Special Employee J. A. Galloway has found and destroyed four distilleries, two in South Carolina and two in Transylvania county, this state. The energetic raider, paid out about 2,500 gallons of beer ready for distillation and a quantity of mash.
