NEW COALITION CABINET ASSUMES CONTROL IN RUSSIA

In Taking Place of Council of Five, the New Government States Its Aims—Wants to Bring Country Out of Anarchy and Put Army and Navy in Fighting Shape—Constituent Assembly to Meet Soon

Petrograd, Oct. 9 (Delayed).—The new coalition government assumed control of Russia today, replacing the council of five organized a month ago.

Announcement was made that the new government intends to carry out an active foreign policy with "the purpose of making peace in agreement with our allies as soon as possible." Meanwhile the government will take steps to bring the army to its highest fighting power and to restore economic and social tranquility to the country.

The new coalition cabinet, including four members of the constitutional democratic party and one independent, seems to have met with the approval of the Petrograd press except the radical Novaya Nishin, which is pro-Fermin.

The cabinet is composed of the following:

- Premier, A. E. Kerensky.
- Minister of foreign affairs, M. I. Terezhchenko.
- Minister of interior, M. Nikitin.
- Minister of agriculture, M. Avsenkov.
- Minister of labor, M. Gvozdev.
- Minister of supplies, M. Prokopovitch.
- Minister of finance, M. Rensarsky.
- Minister of religion, M. Karysheff.
- Minister of public welfare, M. Kishkin.
- Minister of trade and industry, A. I. Konovaloff.
- State controller, M. Suvoroff.
- Minister of justice, M. Malynkovich.
- Minister of education, M. Salpeter.
- President of the economical council, M. Tsvetkovoff.
- Minister of war, General Vorkhovskiy.
- Minister of marine, Admiral Verderevskiy.
- Minister of ways and communications, M. Litvinsky.

Opposed by Council. The Petrograd council of workmen and soldiers' delegates announced in the Novaya Nishin that "We welcomed and the mission of Petrograd give the new government no support. We are persuaded that the announcement of the new cabinet will get from all members of the revolutionary democracy one answer: 'Resign.'"

Aims of Government. In addition to carrying out an active foreign policy the new government will issue an official statement declaring that the serious internal difficulty of Russia is due chiefly to the Korniloff rebellion. The new government pledges that its business acts will be on the basis of agreements between representatives of the bourgeoisie, the tax-paying elements and the revolutionary democracy. It points out that the success of such a position is possible only if the nation is united. The government's statement in conclusion says that it has three principal aims:

- To raise the fighting power of the armies and navies.
- To bring order to the country by fighting anarchy.
- To call the constituent assembly as soon as possible.

The coalition cabinet absorbs the council of five which has held sway since the Korniloff revolt, piloting the country through a perilous political crisis. The council of five apparently carried out Premier Kerensky's program in full. It succeeded in ending the Korniloff affair except for some agitation on the part of the radical councils of workmen and soldiers' delegates. Seemingly it turned the democratic congress which was planned originally to overthrow the Kerensky government into a force of support.

Democratic Congress Next Week. The first session of the preliminary parliament, which grew out of the democratic congress, will be called by the government probably next week. In the meantime Minister of Public Welfare Kishkin and State Controller Suvoroff have returned to Moscow to plan the Kerensky plan before their followers for approval.

The new cabinet consists of six socialists, four constitutional democrats and seven members of other parties. Foreign Minister Terezhchenko, it is reported, will be sent to Paris to represent Russia at the allied conference.

SHORT SYNOPSIS OF THE 'WARFARE OF THE FLESH'

The Warfare of the Flesh will be shown at the Strand today and tomorrow. A part of this picture was made in Asheville a few months ago. A synopsis of the play follows:

George Harmon, a man of the world, who considers woman a toy to be purchased by any man with money, is one of the tools of Satan and King of modern folk named John Eyll and Agnes Sinn. Harmon wages his "get" any woman he wants. Henry Goodie, a force for Good, accepts the wager. Gregory's devoted young wife, Jane, is Harmon's target. After a serious accident, it is found that an expensive operation is necessary to save Gregory's life. In desperation, Jane falls into the trap and seeks Harmon's financial aid. Agnes Sinn, goading her into the belief that she should make the sacrifice. However, she is saved by a vivid dream experienced during a moment of unconsciousness and awakens to realize that her husband would not wish life at such a price. Her decision rouses the dormant manhood in Harmon, who acknowledges his defeat, confessing that "no good woman can be bought." Meantime, spiritual love redeems, through its agent, Mr. Goodie, who arranges for the operation that restores the young husband to his wife and baby.

It is a story that bears detailed analysis and through it reveals a depth of purpose that could only be shown in the superb production which really dominates the story itself. The contrasting situations and the artistry revealed in settings, photography and titles make it an unusual and remarkable film. The decisive dream is a very ordinary effect on the screen, but as used in this film it is an extraordinary effect. No producer could more cleverly discuss it or accomplish so much in the surprise which comes with the realization that it is the experience of an unconscious mind. After the big climax that follows, the story moves forward to a swift and satisfactory denouement.

NORWEGIAN SHIP DESTROYED SEPT 3

The Majoren, of 4,300 tons gross, left Philadelphia on August 20 with iron for Glasgow. The 23 members of the crew were rescued by a patrol vessel 36 hours after they took to the small boats.
