Pressure is also low off the north Atlantic coast. It is somewhat warmer in the Plains states and the Mississippi valley but as a rule temperature changes have been slight. CONVICTS MAY FINISH OLD FORT HIGHWAY

County commissioners, City Commissioner Silkeleather, Dr. Carl V. Reynolds, County Engineer T. M. Varner of the North Carolina Good Roads association, chairman of the prison board, and J. R. Collier, superintendent of the state prison.

It had been stated that the prison officials would remove the convicts to the state farm to pick cotton, but it is thought now that arrangements can be made to leave them on the road until it is completed.
