# WAR STAMPS FOR PARCEL POST AFTER DECEMBER

One Cent for Packages of 25 Cents Postage or Each **Fraction Thereof** 

After December 1, a war tax stamp will have to be paid on all parcel post packages, on which the postage amounts to 25 cents or over. The tax will be one cent for each package for

"The commissioner of internal revenue shall furnish to the postmaster-general, without prepayment, a suitable quantity of adhesive stamps to be distributed to and kept on sale by the various postmasters in the United States. The postmaster-general may require each next materials. states. The postmaster seneral may cress will be asked to enact when it require each postmaster to give additional or increased bond as postmaster for the value of the stamps as furnished, and each such postmaster shall deposit the receipts from the sale of such stamps to the credit of and render accounts to the postmaster; can be compared at such times and in such form as he may by regulations prescribe. The postmaster-general shall salt least once monthly transfer all colds.
