GENERAL ORDERS, NO. 4. ADJUTANT AND INSP'R GENERAL'S OFFICE,)

Richmond, February 8, 1865. COMMANDERS OF ARMIES, DEl partments or districts, will enforce THE PUBLIC AND OUR PATRONS ARE the following Act of Congress in all sections informed that Wednesdays and Fridays in which the enemy may be advancing. They will hold subordinate officers, charged with the duty of carrying out its provisions,

> responsible for its proper execution : An Act to regulate the Destruction of Property under Military Necessity, and to pro

vide for Indemnity thereof. "Section 1. The Congress of the Confederate States of America do enact, That army are hereby authorized and directed to stores, or other property of any kind whatever, which may aid the enemy in the prosecution of the war, when necessary to prefalling into the hands of the enemy."

* * * * * * [Approved March 17, 1862.]

II. Officers will be calm and considerate in the performance of the duty enjoined by these orders. They will not be justified in the destruction of property, unless the necessity therefor be reasonably established.

III. As far as practicable, notice of the approach of danger should be given ewners of property, and every precaution for its removal that circumstances will permit should be taken.

RD'ORS ARMIES OF THE C. S., February 11th, 1885.

THE DISCIPLINE AND EFFICIENCY of the army have been greatly impaired by men leaving their proper commands to join others, in which they find service more agreeable.

This practice, almost as injurious in its consequences as the crime of descriton, by the Articles of War, exposes the offender to a similar punishment, and subjects the officer receiving him to dismissal from the

It is therefore declared that the provisions of General Order No. 2 of this date, army headquarters, apply to such men as have left their proper commands and joined others without being regularly transferred. the military authorities of the Confederate They will receive the parden promised in that order topon complying with its condidestroy cotton, tobacco, military and naval tions, or suffer the consequences attached to neglecting it

The names of such absencees will be forthwith reported to these headquarters by the vent the same, or any part thereof, from officers with whom they are serving, and immediate measures taken to return them te their proper commands.
